SCN 101: Introduction to Seneca Language



This course is intended for students with minimal to no language ability in Seneca. This course will concentrate on developing student's speaking proficiency of Seneca at the novice level. To this end, students will also develop an understanding of the basic grammatical structures of Seneca. Since Seneca is a verb-based and polysynthetic language, this course will focus primarily on conversation and verb construction in order to provide students with a strong foundation to progress with learning Seneca after completing the course. This course will also explore Haudenosaunee (Iroquois) culture, traditions, and perspective as it relates to language.
